



MEMORIAL SLOAN KETTERING SUMMER INTERNSHIP INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

The MWCABC Research Committee in Collaboration with Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center's Dr. Christopher Klebanoff, are honored to offer a 6-8 week summer internship program. This program is designed for a mature, energetic, highly motivated and independently minded college or post Baccalaureate student who can demonstrate a serious interest and academic strength in science. It provides an opportunity to work with Christopher Klebanoff, MD, world-renowned Breast Cancer Physician and Immunologist in his state-of-the art-facility in NYC. This comprehensive experience will include laboratory work, clinical experience and participation academic journal club.

Program Requirements:

Interested students must submit the following by **FEBRUARY 21, 2018**

- An essay indicating why they should be considered for participation in this internship (max 1 page)
- Resume including any science research or medical experience
- A letter of recommendation from a college faculty member (preferably science, but others accepted) sent directly to MWCABC.research@gmail.com to maintain confidentiality
- Copy of college transcript
- Completed application

Interview: Following completion of application and submission of documents, qualified candidates will be scheduled for either an in person or skype/facetime interview with members of the Internship selection committee.



Copies to Researcher: The accepted candidates documents will be forwarded to the researcher as part of the application process for his review and input in choosing a candidate.

Review Laboratory Studies: Once selected for the program, the student is required to review information about the studies that have been conducted by the participating research lab before beginning the summer research program.

Final Essay: Upon completion of the internship program the student must submit a 2 page essay explaining what he or she has learned during their internship. This essay may be used by the MWCABC for publication.

Eligibility: The participating student should reside in Manhasset, however applications will be considered if the candidate has significant ties to Manhasset and or the MWCABC

Other information:

- The program will be approximately 6-8 weeks during the summer of 2018.
- There is some flexibility with dates but internship must be completed between May 7 and Aug 31, 2018.
- Hours will be Monday through Friday, generally 8:45am-4:45pm with potential for slight variation.
- The student selected may be responsible for transportation costs to/from MSKCC, however we are working on trying to fund/offset costs
- The awardee may be asked to speak briefly about his/her experience at an MWCABC function.
- The participating hospital/laboratory may require additional "on boarding" paperwork including a physical exam, drug testing, ID badge and security clearance.
